On Community Outcomes, Indicators, and Strategies

The FCFC's Focus on Results

In 2010, the Logan County Family & Children First Council began using a set of tools and concepts called Results Based Accountability (RBA) developed by Mark Friedman of the Fiscal Policy Studies Institute to analyze how well the county as a whole supports, nurtures, educates and protects families, children, and adults. RBA starts with those end conditions of well-being (results) and determines appropriate actions to take (means) that will positively impact the result. This is accomplished through a simple progression of thought broken down into three questions:

In defining community well-being, the Council identified four desired results: 1) Healthy People & Behaviors, 2) Stable Families, 3) Young People Succeeding, and 4) Safe & Supportive Neighborhoods. Outcome teams, consisting of Council and community members, were formed for each result area. Then, the Council appointed local Champions to facilitate the RBA process with each team. The Council has committed to providing this report annually to the community. The first, 2010 Annual Report, covered the first two RBA questions. The second, 2011 Annual Report, will add the third RBA question of, "What will it take to get there," and provide the community with a plan for how to make progress toward the county's desired results.

Positive role models are plentiful, and others in the community talk to teenagers with candor & respect about the difficult choices they face.
