SERVICE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

We are continuing to further the Results Based Accountability process and use it to now dig deeper into the [first outcome report which will be published with the Bellefontaine Examiner on November 5, 2010.](#) This initial report is considered a baseline for the indicators that are included.

In this past quarter we are continuing to meet monthly in our 4 outcome team areas of Healthy People and Behaviors, Stable Families, Young People Succeeding and Safe and Supportive Neighborhoods to dig deeper into the data.

In the video presentations on Results-Based Accountability that the teams are using for guidance, Mark Friedman, states "all performance measures that have ever existed for any program in the history of the universe involve answering two sets of interlocking questions---How much did we do? How well did we do it?" One other important question, and the most challenging to answer is: "Is anyone better off?"

We will continue to look behind the numbers and each team will be developing a page for each measure tied to the 4 outcomes that will allow us to cite current programs that impact the outcome and track

PROJECT CHILD

Over the past couple of months the Project Child committee has been busy covering a variety of topics. The committee has dedicated some time to reviewing kindergarten readiness throughout the county. One of the tools used to measure readiness is the KRA-L (Kindergarten Readiness Assessment-Literacy). This assessment measures kindergarteners skills set specifically in literacy. The Young People Succeeding committee will be working on gathering more information from local school districts to identify similarities & differences.

Birth to three services (Help Me Grow, Early Head Start, Newborn home visiting) have seen referrals and engaged families increase over the past few months. A new brochure has been developed defining the services offered and who provides them. Child find efforts include Fall Screening in October, Ring of Lights in October, and Light A Little Star in November. HMG and EHS had their combined fall family event in which books were distributed through the Reading is Fundamental (RIF) program.

Council on Rural Services continues overseeing the Early Childhood Mental Health grant in which services are provided by Colleen Wallace. Sites are determined by DJFS funding sources. As the school year progresses we will see an increase of services being provided.

Children Services is offering Kinship Training and Parenting Practices training. The Health Department addressed raising awareness of the increase in whooping cough cases and the need for adults to be revaccinated to prevent the spread of the illness.



TRIAGE

Triage continues to meet weekly to oversee the service coordination process. Since July 1st, 24 referrals for service coordination were approved (19 Informal, 3 formal, 3 consultation). The top 3 referral sources include Children Services (36%), Mental Health Agencies (20%), and Family Court (20%).

In September, there were a total of 73 open Teams with Service Coordination. This is the highest number of cases open during one month since tracking began 3-years ago. Nearly 20% (14) cases are facilitated with the FCFC Program Coordinator and 80% with a member agency facilitator as Service Coordinator.

Many different agencies are allowing employees to serve as facilitator of teams. Children Services facilitated 44% (32) of teams active in September, Board of DD 17% (12), and Family Court facilitated 14% (10).

Triage has approved 66 funding requests to support active Service Coordination teams since July 1st and has spent nearly \$34,000 on Summer Academy (26%), Service Coordination (19%), Family Coaching (19%), placements (12%), and respite (11%).
