# SERVICE COORDINATION

### Child and Family Teams

A brief guide to Service  
Coordination and parental rights in  
Logan County.



## What is Service Coordination?

Service coordination is a way of organizing services for families and children. It finds agencies, people and services that can help children and families. Then, with the family's involvement, it creates a plan to get the child and family what they need.

### Activities of Service Coordination:

- ◆ The coordination of evaluations and assessments
- ◆ The development & evaluation of a Comprehensive Wraparound Plan.
- ◆ The identification of available service providers
- ◆ The coordination and monitoring of service delivery
- ◆ Referral to advocacy services
- ◆ The development of a transition plan when service coordination ends



## Who is eligible for Service Coordination?

Any Logan County family with a child under the age of 21 in need of a coordinated plan to address needs in 2 or more areas of life, that are unable to be met by an individual agency may be eligible for service coordination.



## How to refer for Service Coordination?

Typically, an agency worker already involved with the family will refer that family for Service Coordination.

However, any family has the right to self-refer for Service Coordination to the Family and Children First Council.

Referrals can be made by calling Family and Children First Council or by submitting the Child & Family Team referral form.

## What happens after the referral is made?

FCFC will do an initial assessment to determine what level of coordination is needed for the family. The inter-system Triage Team reviews and accepts all cases into Service Coordination.

## What are Parent Rights for Service Coordination?

1. Initiate a team meetings;
2. Request a review of the individualized comprehensive family plan; and
3. Utilize the Dispute Resolution Process when it is believed that service coordination is not working in the family's best interest .
